- Aim: improve co-operation and information exchange
- OECD nations
- Objectives include:
 - Strengthen national R&D capabilities.
 - Share research costs.
 - Pool technical resources.
 - Avoid duplication and unproductive research paths.
 - Network researchers.
 - Standardise methodologies.
 - Harmonise technical standards.
 - Enhance the quality of R&D outputs.
 - Disseminate information on technology capabilities.
 - Accelerate the deployment of new technologies.
